Our "re-gathering" process at Yellow Creek has begun! This doesn't mean everything is back to normal, but it means we are taking steps in that direction. Each Sunday, we will livestream our worship service on Facebook just as we have been, but our sanctuary will be open for those who wish to come for the worship service. In accordance with state guidelines, we will observe several restrictions:

- * Don't come if you're sick or if you won't be comfortable with others
- * Masks are strongly recommended
- * All physical contact is discouraged
- * Family groups should sit together
- * Seating will be on alternating pews with spacing between families
- * No Sunday School, choir, nursery, or childcare
- * We can only occupy 33% of our sanctuary
- * Overflow spaces are available in the choir room and student room
- * Limited restroom availability (avoid using the restroom, if possible)
- * Offering buckets will be available at the rear of the sanctuary
- * Please do not linger inside the building after the service concludes

There is no pressure for you to attend. We realize that different people view our situation differently, and we want to be gracious to everyone. We are striving for a balance of courage and caution. We look forward to worshipping with you soon, whether via social media or in-person. Call our church office if you have any questions.

FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

Greetings to you on the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! As we worship, we invite you to join us in celebrating our risen Lord.

The apostle Paul wrote, "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord, walk as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8). Jesus stressed the positive effect we can have on others when He said, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16). If sin dims our light, some we might have influenced for Christ may drift on in spiritual darkness.

On a dark and stormy night on Lake Erie, a boat rocked and plunged near the Cleveland Harbor. "Are we on course?" asked the captain, seeing only a single beacon on the lighthouse. "Quite sure, sir" replied the officer at the helm. "Where are the lower lights?" "Gone out sir." Can we make the harbor?" "We must, or perish" came the reply!" With a steady hand and a stalwart heart, the officer headed the ship toward land. In the darkness he missed the channel and the vessel was dashed to pieces on the rocks. Many lives were lost.

This incident moved Philip P. Bliss to write his familiar hymn, "Let the Lower Lights Be Burning." Jesus, the Light of the World, has returned to heaven leaving us the responsibility to shine as the "lower lights" that can guide sinners to the harbor of His redeeming grace. If our light goes out we will lose the influence to persuade others to trust Jesus. Let us shine our lights in a dark world reflecting the transforming light of Jesus, the Christ.

SERMON OUTLINE

"The Judgment Seat of Christ" 2 Corinthians 5:1-11

We have been examining the Second Coming of Jesus Christ. As we have seen, the rapture is the next great event on God's calendar of events. Last week we examined heaven as the eternal home of the saved. We saw heaven as a place of life, liberty, love, likeness, light and the presence of the Lord. Something very important happens for believers in the air after the rapture and before we all appear in heaven—the judgment seat of Christ. The judgment seat of Christ will be the time we will be evaluated and rewarded accordingly.

The Bible uses the word "judgment" in two senses—condemnation and the dispensing of rewards. The first is in reference to unbelievers. Romans 8:1 and John 5:24 state there is no condemnation for those "in Christ." The second is in reference to believers—for we all <u>must</u> appear before Christ's judgment seat.

The Greek word *bema* means a place of inspection, examination, or evaluation for the purpose of dispensing rewards. The *bema* was an elevated platform where victorious athletes went to receive their crowns. Corinth possessed such a platform to dispense both athletic rewards and legal justice (Acts 18:12-16).

- I. The Blessedness of this Judgment (Revelation 20:6)
 - 1. Only for believers
 - 2. True believers are guaranteed heaven (Psalm 103:10-12)
 - 3. Believers already possess eternal life (John 5:24)
 - 4. The price is paid in full (1 Peter 2:24)
 - 5. Jesus Christ is the sin offering (2 Corinthians 5:21)
 - 6. The foundation for salvation is certain (1 Corinthians 3:10-15)
- II. The Burden of this Judgment
 - 1. The Father shall wipe away all tears (Revelation 21:4)
 - a. The ones not there?
 - b. What could have been?
 - 2. Everyone does not receive the same reward
 - a. Based on faithfulness (1 Corinthians 4:2)
 - b. Will we hear "Well done"?
 - 3. Some will suffer loss of rewards (Revelation 3:11)
 - 4. Some will receive a full reward (2 John 8)
