Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! As we worship, we invite you to join us in celebrating our risen Lord.

“And you shall consecrate the fiftieth year, and proclaim liberty throughout all the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a Jubilee for you; and each of you shall return to his possession, and each of you shall return to his family” (Leviticus 25:10). This verse is especially significant in American history as the verse from which the great exhortation was taken on the first Independence Day—“Proclaim liberty throughout the land to all inhabitants thereof!” This verse has ever been associated with the Liberty Bell and Independence Hall.

Today we have the wonderful privilege and blessing of participating in the ordinance of the Lord's Supper. The Lord's Supper pictures for us Jesus' passion to redeem us and His promise to return for us.

As we prepare to observe the Lord's Supper, let us heed the words of Scripture: “So let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup.”

- I. The Lord's Supper is a time of remembrance

 2. The passing over of the death angel

 1. The new exodus (Luke 9:31)
 2. The new experience (2 Corinthians 5:17)
- II. The Lord's Supper is a time of representation
 - A. The Bread—His sinless body (Isaiah 53:4-6, 1 Peter 2:24)
 - B. The Wine—His sacrificial blood (1 Peter 1:18-19)
- III. The Lord's Supper is a time of reflection
 - A. We are to look back and remember His passion
 - B. We are to look inward and remember His presence
 - C. We are to look forward and remember His purpose
 - D. We are to look upward and remember His person
 - E. We are to look around and remember His power
