Class of David: FH103 (Fellowship Hall 3)

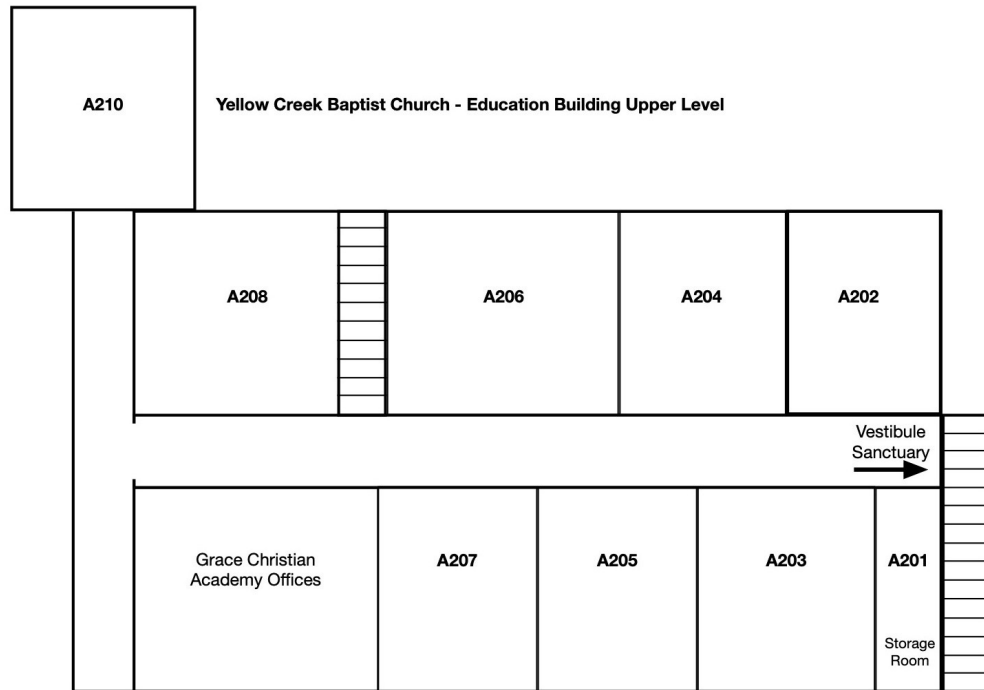
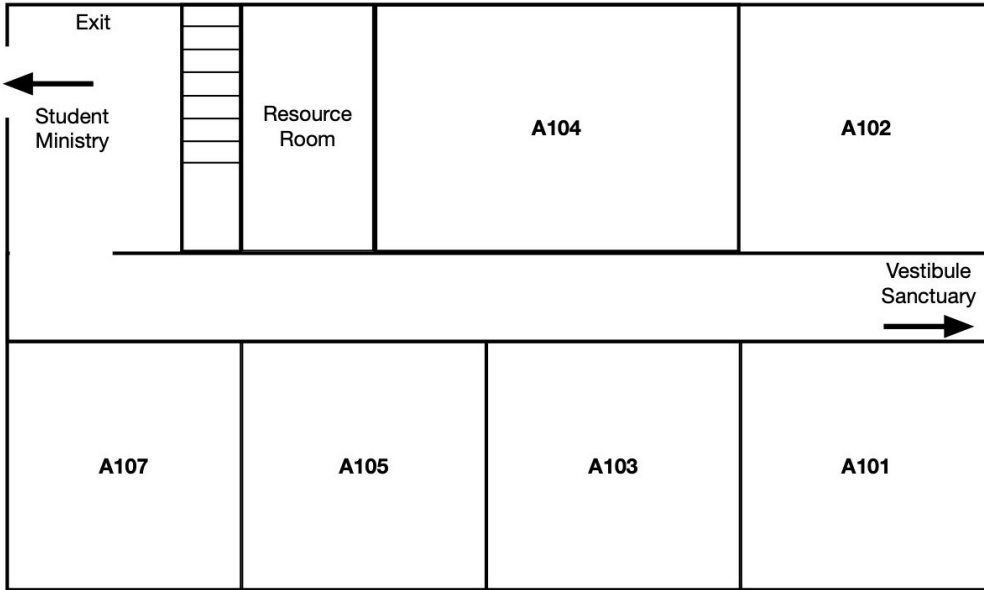
Who: Men (*single and married*) 40's and Up

Teachers: Henry Crabtree, David Hawes, Jerry Kessinger

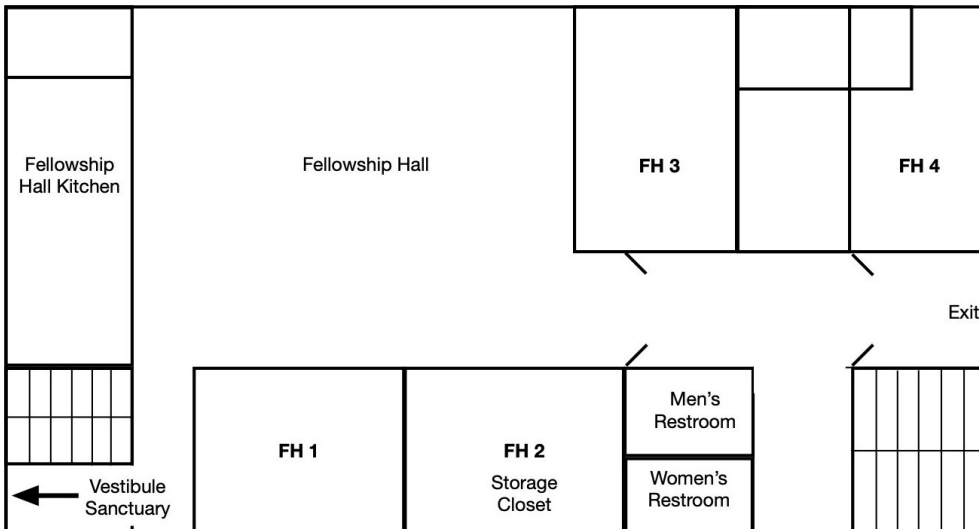

Bible Study Curriculum

The Gospel Project takes adults on a chronological, Christ-centered journey through the storyline of Scripture. Participants will encounter God's plan of redemption in Scripture through study of the biblical narrative, the essential doctrines of the faith, and the call to join in God's mission.

Winter Study: From Captivity to the Wilderness. As God called Moses, delivered His people, and parted the Red Sea, He remained faithful to His promises. We will see that God's holy, merciful, and loving nature is worthy of all our praise.

Bible Studies for Life is designed to help adult groups make disciples through in-depth Bible study that addresses real-life issues. Each year, the series addresses the eight signposts of spiritual growth to ensure a balanced approach to discipleship.

Winter Study: Irrefutable: Prophecies that Point Us to Jesus (which shows that the life and mission of the Messiah was planned long before Jesus was born) and How to Avoid Life's Pitfalls (a look at the life of Joseph in the Book of Genesis). A special session entitled Seeking Justice in an Unjust World is also included.

Explore the Bible is designed to illuminate the historical, cultural, and biblical context of Scripture. Book by book, we help adults understand and apply God's Word in a manner that is practical, sustainable, and thorough.

Winter Study: The Books of Ezekiel and Daniel. From familiar stories that have been cherished for generations to intriguing visions of the end times, and unique perspectives on how God works among His people and how He steadfastly reigns as Lord of all.

MasterWork: Essential Messages from God's Servants is an interactive Bible study designed for individuals, Sunday School classes, and groups, who appreciate the spiritual insights of trusted Christian authors and leaders.
