MESSAGE FROM GOD'S WORD

"The Life of Prayer" Luke 11:1-8; Luke 18:1-8

Dr. Earl Clark, Greek and New Testament professor at Clear Creek Baptist College, said, "Prayer is one of the most talked about subjects in the church, but one of the least practiced." The Ellis Research Group did an extensive survey concerning the prayer life of pastors in America. They found that pastors spend fewer than thirty minutes a day in prayer.

For Jesus, prayer was as necessary as breathing. If the Son of God felt such a strong need for prayer, constant contact with the Father, how much more should we?

Jesus is our prime example of true prayerfulness. He awakened very early in the morning to pray (Mark 1:35). He would withdraw often during the day to pray (Like 5:16). He would also spend time at night in prayer (Luke 6:12). Sometimes He would prevail in prayer all night long! Every major decision was bathed in intense, direct prayer seeking the Father's perfect will.
